The Parking Authority of the City of East Orange is a member of the National Parking Association (NPA). Upon hiring employees, the board of directors uses industry standards and local cost of living guidelines to determine a fair and accurate compensation. The board also reviews and signs off on all employees before they are hired. All salaries are approved by the board of directors before employment begins. The board uses these same guidelines to determine the salary of the operations manager listed on page N4 (2 of 2).

Question 12: The Authority provides sandwiches and snacks at the monthly board meeting for the board members from local deli's and/or supermarkets. The Amount spent per year does not exceed \$1000 per year.

Question 13: The operations manager attended a conference directly related to Parking Authority rules, regulations and operations. The Authority paid for (or reimbursed) the operations manager for expenses related to Hotel room, airfare, and the cost of the conference. All receipts were presented to the board for proper reimbursement. The total cost of attending was \$2216.08

Question 1: The proposed annual budget indicates an increase in revenues as a result of being awarded ticket share revenue from the City of East Orange. Revenues are also anticipated to increase due to the hiring of additional parking enforcement officers (PEO's). The proposed budget includes additional expenses (specifically to Payroll and consulting) which the Authority first incurred in the year 2017. The budget reflects an additional expense for hiring PEO's as well as continuing to hire a Full-time executive director. These expenses were inserted to specifically show the city of East Orange that it is imperative for the Authority to receive ticket share revenue and additional permit income if it expects to survive. After reviewing the proposed expenses, it is the recommendation of the board to receive no less than \$10 per written ticket as part of the ticket share from the City of East Orange. Furthermore, the City of East Orange has indicated it will NOT pay ticket share revenue if a Full-Time Executive director is not hired. It is imperative to the financial strength of the Authority that a Full-Time Executive Director be hired to maximize on this revenue stream. The budget reflects a proposed salary of \$120,000 for this position.

There are variances on page F4 above 10% however, these variances are because the Authority is planning to hire additional employees and also hire a full-time Executive Director. The previous budget called for a part-time Executive Director only.

Question 2: As stated in previous budget reports, the proposed annual budget will have a significant positive impact on the Authority assuming that it receives ticket-share revenue from the city of East Orange.

Question 3: The state of the local economy has been unchanged for many years. The economic strength of the city remains low. No major shifts (positively or negatively) are expected for the region during the budget period.

Question 6: The proposed budget does not reflect an anticipated deficit from 2019 operations. No deficit reduction plan is required at this time.

Question 7: Overnight Lot Permit parking \$55 month

Overnight Street Permit Parking:

1st car is \$150/yr, 2nd car \$100/yr, 3+ \$75 each/yr

On street parking meters consist of 339 spaces at a rate of \$1.00/hr

Question 11: The Chairman and the additional board members do not receive compensation for their services to the parking authority. The board of directors reviews and signs off on all employees before they are hired. All salaries are approved by the board of directors before employment begins.

Question 12: The Authority provides sandwiches and snacks at the monthly board meeting for the board members from local deli's and/or supermarkets. The Amount spent per year does not exceed \$1000 per year.

Question 13: The operations manager attended a conference directly related to Parking Authority rules, regulations and operations. The Authority paid for (or reimbursed) the operations manager for expenses related to Hotel room, airfare, and the cost of the conference. All receipts were presented to the board for proper reimbursement.

### NOTES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Note 1: The Authority would like to purchase 2 additional vehicles at a cost of approximately \$35,000. The Authority has an Insurance Settlement reflected on its balance sheet of \$26,045. This money should be used to purchase the additional vehicles.

Note 2: The 2020 Budget has accounted for the following desired employee positions on page F4:

- 2 additional Part-Time Day Parking Enforcement officers (\$11/hr.) 30 hours per week
- 2 additional Night Parking Enforcement Officers (\$15/hr.) 30 hours per week
- Full Time Executive Director
